

2026 GOALS & OBJECTIVES

We look forward to another successful year in 2026. Crestview Hills' focus will remain excellent customer service and sound financial stewardship, keeping taxes low while providing high quality service to our residents and businesses. We anticipate completing several important projects during the coming year to improve our community.

The following is a list of Objectives for 2026:

1. Continue to work with KYTC and their consultant to address the traffic congestion on Turkeyfoot Road and Thomas More Parkway, encouraging solutions that are the least disruptive to the community. Strongly lobby our state elected officials for right-of-way and utility relocation funding for this project in this next 2-year state budget cycle, as well as construction funding in the next budget.
2. Celebrate Crestview Hills' 75th Anniversary of incorporation as a Kentucky city with various commemorative events and a semi-formal dinner.
3. Continue ongoing efforts to rebuild or repave older city streets, and utilize grant funding for these projects when possible. Implement advice provided by our City Engineer on current conditions and plan for the future street replacement and maintenance.
4. Work with Elevar Design Group to finalize the design and bidding of construction of the expansion and improvement of the City Building. Ideally, start construction sometime in the Spring.
5. Work with JTM Smith Construction to complete the replacement of the Lookout Farm Drive Culvert/Bridge over Dry Creek starting this spring.
6. Complete the engineering work for the Horsebranch Road improvements, including drainage and creek stabilization – and start construction in Fall 2026, if possible.
7. Continue to invest in the Thomas More Office Park to keep this area aesthetically pleasing and a driving force for the City and Northern Kentucky's economy.
8. Work on other public works projects including, Dixie Highway Sidewalk, Woodspoint Drive repaving, Thomas More Parkway and Centre View Blvd grant-funded road work.
9. Work with property owners and developers to find the location for a high-end hotel that will benefit Crestview Hills and its partners in the area. This could include utilizing a mixed-use development concept.
10. Work with Thomas More University as they work on updating their campus and graduate/undergraduate programs for students and athletes as they are now NCAA Division II.
11. Maintain the highest level of professionalism in city government and continue to enhance the community's reputation as a prime destination for businesses and residents.

I look forward to working with the City Council, City Staff, businesses and residents in the coming year to achieve these objectives.
